APA	Until end of semester	The American Psychological Association has opened up the modules Research Methods and Introduction to Social Psychology on their Psyclearn platform to institutions moving to online education because of Corona. Educators should contact APA directly.
Cambridge University Press (CUP)	Currently scaling up to meet demand. Should be available until the end of May	Free access to the html version of all 700 textbooks in the Cambridge Core collection. This is an extensive collection containing textbooks for almost all disciplines, be it language, computer science or mathematics.
Gale		Gale has opened up a collection of 9 e-books on how to transition from physical to online education.
De Gruyter		De Gruyter opened up a large part of its own print titles and of titles from partnering presses on the De Gruyter platform.

JOVE	Access Until June 15	JoVE is offering all educational videos for free on its platform. The JoVE Core collection helps students get to grip with and visualize key concepts in biology and social psychology. The JoVE Science Education is a collection of video demonstrations from 8 different disciplines, such as chemistry and physics, that may be used as surrogate for lab experiments. The Lab Manual is a set of videos of laboratory techniques for introductory biology courses.
Kahoot	Until end of semester	Kahoot is a tool for quizzing students in online learning. For affected universities the full version of Kahoot is free until the end of the semester. Educators may request an account directly at Kahoot.
Ohio State University Press	For the duration of the COVID-19 crisis	Free access to all monographs and the linguistic textbook <i>Language Files</i> .
Oxford University Press		Resources for students and teachers are free to use, even if the lesson method is not currently being used in your program. OUP also offers some online courses on creating blended learning through Epigeum. The publisher mentions the use of e-books through RedShelf or VitalSource, however this is for US universities only.
Project Muse	Dates vary by publisher, mostly end of May or end of June	Over 20 publishers offering their e-books and journals on Project Muse have decided to make their contents freely available to support teaching and research during this crisis. These materials are marked with a distinctive free icon. Amongst the publishers are: Johns Hopkins University Press (all books and journals), Ohio State University Press (all books and journals), University of Nebraska Press (all books and journals), University of North Carolina Press (all books), Temple University Press (all books), and Vanderbilt University Press (selected books).
