MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT




The name Hellenic American University reflects the founders' vision of an institution of learning that would embody values of two cultures: the spirit of innovation, reward of merit

Students at Hellenic American College are enrolled in the degree programs of Hellenic American University, a private, non-profit American university founded in the state of New Hampshire in 2004. In addition to offering its degree programs in Athens through an Agreement of Cooperation with Hellenic American College, the University also operates an instructional location in Nashua, New Hampshire. Students from both locations are taught by the same body of faculty and are awarded their degrees directly from Hellenic American University upon completing their studies and fulfilling their degree requirements.





RECOGNITION IN GREECE

But learning continues beyond the classroom, too. All degree programs feature opportunities for out-ofclass, experiential learning — professional training workshops, master classes, student-faculty research projects, participation in conferences, and field work.

FACULTY MENTORING

Mentoring is an important part of the Hellenic American College experience. When you are admitted to the College, you are assigned a faculty mentor (advisor), usually from your field of study. Your mentor works closely with you as you clarify and plan your educational and career goals, and then identify the skills you need to acquire to meet these objectives. As you progress through your studies, your mentor will help you address problems that might affect your academic performance.

STRENGTHENING YOUR COMMUNICATION SKILLS

You already know that being able to communicate effectively in writing is among the most highly valued professional competencies. Writing assignments is part of nearly every course at Hellenic American College, whether it's a critical essay, lab report, or a research paper. The tutors at the College's Writing Center can provide you with personalized assistance at all stages of the writing process, from planning and composing your paper to revising and editing the text you produce. By the end of your studies, you'll have acquired strong communication skills in the language and confidence as a writer.

Hellenic American College grants various kinds of scholarships:

- Need-based scholarships are awarded to students with demonstrated financial need and who maintain good academic standing.
- Merit-based scholarships are awarded to applicants with exceptional academic achievement, leadership potential or involvement in community service.
- Corporate scholarships are meritbased tuition subsidies awarded to employees of firms and organizations in the College's corporate scholarship program.
- Early admission scholarships are awarded to applicants who meet the University's admission requirements and make an early decision to attend.







